“Suicide and Self Harm”

Richard Jones was a psychoanalytic psychotherapist in the NHS from 1980 until 2006. He trained with the South Trent Training and has been a training therapist, supervisor and teacher for South Trent, as well as being a member of the Training Committee. He has a particular interest in the psychoanalytic management of suicide risk, with particular reference to the implications of countertransference responses to the threat of suicide. He has developed a private practice in Leicester and is a supervisor for the TCPP.
