Linda Hoag is a Jungian Analytical Psychotherapist in private practice in Birmingham and is a former Chair of the Training in Jungian Analytical Psychotherapy at WMIP. She holds an MSc in Nursing from Yale University, an MA in Counselling and Psychotherapy from Antioch University's Regents College Campus, and trained at The Guild of Psychotherapists in London. Linda has also recently completed training in EMDR.
