2nd February 2019 – Professor Adrian Sutton:

Adrian Sutton explores four key questions arising from his clinical and psychoanalytic thinking about forgiveness, in the context of his work in the NHS in UK and in Northern Uganda:

- Is 'Forgiveness' a *driver* of change, a *target* to be aimed for or at – or is its presence a *marker* of a state of equanimity that brings benefits to individuals?
- Does 'Forgiveness' result from acts of will or does it emerge when a variety of processes interact?
- What does it take to attain and maintain a state of forgiveness?
- What is the relationship between individual experiences of 'Forgiveness' and wider societal and relational processes that promote 'Forgiveness' as morally desirable and pragmatically necessary?

A presentation will be followed by small group discussion and a closing plenary.

Adrian Sutton is Director of The Squiggle Foundation. He is Visiting Professor of Psychiatry at Gulu University, Uganda and Honorary Senior Teaching Fellow in Medical Education at Manchester University. He was previously Consultant in Child & Family Psychiatry and Psychotherapy at the Winnicott Centre, Royal Manchester Children's Hospitals. He is the author of *Psychiatry, Paediatrics and Psychoanalysis: through counter-transference to case management* (2013) and his other publications reflect his interest in applying psychoanalytic understanding in child and family health and welfare, medical education and professional ethics.

30th March 2019 - Otto M Rheinschmiedt:

Dreams and literature are closely related. The dream's essence lies in its narrative facility. Dreams are autobiographical fictions which tell the story of the dreamer's life history, her/his insertion in transgenerational family themes, and her/his ethnic and cultural identity. In that sense dreams are psychosocial depositories and makers, not unlike world literature which recreates interiority and historicity of a given time period.

The interconnected worlds of dreaming and fiction writing tend to employ the same narrative devices: memory (Patrick Modiano), multi-temporality (Gabriel Garcia Marquez), poesis (Kafka, Ted Hughes, Colm Toibin), historical consciousness (Irene Némirovsky), and 'infinite connectivity' (Patrick White).

Otto M Rheinschmiedt is a university lecturer, group analyst, and psychologist in private practice with over thirty years experience of working with dreams. He has written a book on dreams, *The Fictions of Dreams. Dreams, Literature, and Writing*, published by Karnac in May 2017, appeared on BBC Radio shows on dreams, given public lectures on dreams and literature in the UK and abroad, and taught dream interpretation at the University of Bath.
